

Rules and Regulations: Free Athletic Equipment Access

1. Equipment access is available 6:00 AM – 10:00 PM daily April through October. All equipment must be returned to the shed before park closing. Access to the equipment requires unlocking the shed with a keypad code which is made available upon request via the City website, or by contacting the designated Equipment Manager appointed by the Longville Parks and Recreation Committee. For security, codes to access the shed are changed regularly April-October, and the shed is locked completely October-April.
2. Equipment users must be 13 years old or older OR have direct adult supervision. Parents/guardians are responsible for supervising children under 13 years old at all times.
3. Equipment is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Available equipment may include shuffleboard poles/discs, bean bags, basketballs, volleyballs, kickballs, croquet sets, jump ropes, tennis rackets/balls, pickleball paddles/balls/nets, badminton rackets/birdies, and more.
4. All equipment must remain within park grounds. Removing equipment from the park is strictly prohibited and may result in fines and/or a permanent access ban.
5. All equipment must be returned clean and organized to the shed after use. Do not leave equipment scattered throughout the park. Place trash in the park trashcans at the pavilion, or in the small wastebasket provided in the equipment shed.
6. Report damaged or broken equipment immediately to the Equipment Manager. Do not use damaged equipment. Do not attempt repairs yourself.
7. Wash hands before and after equipment use. Restrooms are available on-site. Do not use equipment if feeling feverish or ill, during heavy rain or high wind, or other severe weather conditions.
8. Use equipment at your own risk. The City of Longville assumes no responsibility for injuries, property loss, equipment availability, or damages. Wear appropriate footwear and protective gear as needed.
9. Violations may result in warnings, temporary or permanent access suspension, and potential fines for theft or abuse. Do not share access codes publicly. Report violations to the Equipment Manager.
